Education:
Colonial Williamsburg's dynamic educational programming engages learners of all ages in the powerful stories of our Nation's founding. In the city where Patrick Henry's fiery words and Thomas Jefferson's idealistic declaration ignited a revolution, visitors — teachers, students, school groups, vacationers, and history buffs — step beyond the pages of history books and come face-to-face with the people, documents, debates, thoughts, and dreams of the Revolution.

Coach and Livestock (including Rare Breeds):
Carriage rides through the Historic Area are more popular than ever; we have more carriages and horses on the streets than in previous times, all contributing to the authentic 18th-century atmosphere. Carriages and animals were an integral part of daily life in the colonial era, and continue to maintain a vital role here in Williamsburg. The rare breeds we preserve and care for, some endangered, are animals that our Founders would recognize. These guest favorites — from Leicester Longwool sheep to Cleveland Bay horses — are true living, breathing history.

Preservation:
When walking through Colonial Williamsburg's Historic Area, it is easy to feel as though you have been transported back in time. This is due in large part to the 603 structures, including residences, taverns, shops, government buildings, outbuildings, and churches, that make up our town. Eight-eight of these buildings are more than 200 years old, and approximately 500 reconstructions have reached antique status in their own right. Each structure is a unique non-renewable resource that has been meticulously restored and maintained to create the accurate historical context for the stories we tell of our Nation's founding.

Historic Trades:

For nearly a century, Colonial Williamsburg’s Historic Trades program has preserved and revitalized what were at risk of becoming long-forgotten skills – 18th-century brickmaking, weaving, gardening, and cabinetmaking, to name just a few. Each of Colonial Williamsburg’s 22 Historic Trades demonstrates a profession practiced in the colonial capital and produces goods using 18th-century materials, tools, and techniques. A visit to the trade shops provides visitors with rich sensory experiences that include face-to-face interactions with costumed tradesmen and women, offering unforgettable encounters with early American activity.

Gardens:

Colonial Williamsburg boasts 90 acres of gardens and green spaces, ranging from the formal splendor of the Governor’s Palace grounds to the tranquil Colonial Revival garden at Bassett Hall and the utilitarian kitchen garden of the James Geddy House. Color fills the Historic Area throughout the seasons as heirloom gardens produce tulips, columbine, foxglove, peonies, hollyhocks, chrysanthemums, and more. Colonial Williamsburg’s kitchen gardens yield fresh vegetables and aromatic herbs for the taverns and restaurants in true 18th-century – yet so very 21st century – farm-to-table fashion.

Art Museums:

The world-class Art Museums of Colonial Williamsburg consist of the DeWitt Wallace Decorative Arts Museum and the Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Folk Art Museum – which together house 70,000 antiques and works of art, including portraits, musical instruments, firearms, textiles, ceramics, and silver as well as sculptures and objects created by self-trained artists and craftsmen. In addition, the Museums boast 15,000 architectural artifacts; 60 million archaeological artifacts; and the recently acquired Wooldridge Map Collection, one of the finest collections of early Virginia-related maps assembled outside of the Library of Congress. Engaging and innovative exhibitions highlight our collections as the Art Museums perfectly complement the stories of our Nation’s founding told in the Historic Area. Currently, the Art Museums are undergoing a major expansion that will add a striking street-level entrance, additional exhibition space, a new lobby, café, and store, and state-of-the-art climate controls to ensure ideal artifact preservation.
