Colonial Williamsburg, Kiwanis Club of Williamsburg Co-host 58th Annual Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony Thursday, Dec. 21

Guests and members of the community are invited to kick-off the holiday weekend with a traditional ceremony of beloved stories, songs and lights



WILLIAMSBURG, Va. (Dec. 5, 2017) – Colonial Williamsburg and the Kiwanis Club of Williamsburg join to co-host their 58th annual Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony on Market Square at 5 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 21, kicking off the holiday weekend.

Guests and the community are invited to gather outside the Courthouse on Duke of Gloucester Street, where complementary candles will be shared with guests to kick-off the traditional ceremony of beloved Christmas stories, songs and lights. Mayor Paul Freiling is scheduled to deliver the eagerly awaited signal for the audience to light their candles with help from Kiwanis volunteers. Next comes the climactic illumination of a 40-foot spruce adorned with 6,500 lights by Colonial Williamsburg operations staff. To close the ceremony, a special guest arrives by carriage as Colonial Williamsburg's Fifes & Drums fill the air with music.

"We are thrilled to again partner with Colonial Williamsburg and make this joyous community celebration possible," said Mary Beth Murphy, immediate past president of the Kiwanis Club of Williamsburg.

The community Christmas tree will be lit nightly through Saturday, January 6, 2018, and Colonial Williamsburg's Christmas guns will be fired on Market Square at 5 p.m. Christmas Eve.

"We invite residents and visitors alike to share in this celebration as we all look forward to the height of the holiday season," said Bill Schermerhorn, Colonial Williamsburg creative director

Colonial Williamsburg and the Kiwanis Club have cosponsored the community Christmas Tree Lighting since 1959. The event is free and open to the public; no tickets or reservations are required.
